A Synopsis

The prospects for a prosperous new year are as bright as ever. One of the greatest blessings the new year holds is opportunity. Some recognize the value of opportunities and make resolutions in order to seize as much benefit through personal planning as possible. While maturity may well be displayed in making plans in view of the possible outcome five, ten, or more years from now, wisdom is realized in respecting the relatively narrow limits of life's duration. The wise man urged, "So teach us to number our days, that we may apply our hearts unto wisdom" (Psa. 90:12). The Psalmist referred to "days" not "years." The brevity of life is spoken of as "a step," "a weaver's shuttle," "a shadow," and "a vapor."

A Step

Young David was forced to flee the wrath of Saul. On two occasions Saul had cast a javelin at David in an effort to smite him to the wall (I Sam. 18:11). One missed step in dodging it would have proven fatal for David. He told his trusted friend Jonathan, Saul's son, "...Thy father certainly knoweth that I have found grace in thine eyes; and he saith, Let not Jonathan know this, lest he be grieved: but truly as the LORD liveth, and as thy soul liveth, there is but a step between me and death" (I Sam. 20:3). David wisely watched his step with Saul.

A Shuttle

A skilled weaver sends his shuttle flying through the suspended threads to fashion his fabric. The imagery is employed by desperate Job who said, "My days are swifter than a weaver's shuttle, and are spent without hope" (Job 7:6). The loss of flocks, family, fortune, and fame challenged Job's faith, but he focused on the future in eternity with God (Job 1:20-22).

A Shadow

Job, burdened by his loses, said, "Man that is born of a woman is of few days, and full of trouble. He cometh forth like a flower, and is cut down: he fleeth also as a shadow, and continueth not" (Job 14:1-2). So, Job repeatedly acknowledged his temporal nature and submitted to the eternal God who finally blessed him beyond measure.

A Smoke

Still air about a candle snuffed out sends the smoke streaming upward like a thin white ribbon. The twists and

turns it takes hardly can be appreciated until momentarily it is gone. The KJV speaks of life "even as a vapour," but the ASV of 1901 has "ye are a vapor." James wrote, "Go to now, ye that say, To day or to morrow we will go into such a city, and continue there a year, and buy and sell, and get gain: Whereas ye know not what shall be on the morrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapour, that appeareth for a little time, and then vanisheth away. For that ye ought to say, If the Lord will, we shall live, and do this, or that" (James 4:13-15).

A Summary

Opportunities are related to time. "Boast not thyself of to morrow; for thou knowest not what a day may bring forth," wrote one of the wisest men who ever lived (Prov. 27:1). In developing great plans for the new year, the role each individual day plays is crucial to the outcome. Sage and scriptural advice is "We then, as workers together with him, beseech you also that ye receive not the grace of God in vain. (For he saith, I have heard thee in a time accepted, and in the day of salvation have I succoured thee: behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation)" (Isa. 49:8; II Cor. 6:1-2).
