## We Are Like Jonah - Sometimes?

The reasons Jonah didn't want to preach to Nineveh, the capital city of Assyria, make for fascinating discussion. But that's not the subject of this article. He did finally go, and in fact, Nineveh did repent before God and were for a while approved by God.

Focus on Jonah 4:5-11. Jonah has gone to the East side of the city, presumably on a hill, to watch and see if the city would repent or would remain in sin and be destroyed by God. God, being disturbed that Jonah was hoping for the latter, created an object lesson that you and I need to understand and apply. God had a shady plant to grow up over Jonah to block the hot sun. "So Jonah was exceeding glad of the gourd (plant)" (4:6). He enjoyed that pleasant shade. But then God reversed Himself the next day and had some kind of worm infest the plant and destroy it. Jonah was furious over the matter, and God pointed out that Jonah had nothing to do with that plant coming up, nor with it helping him. It was God's business, and God had allowed a blessing to come from it – but it was just that – a blessing. LESSON? God made Nineveh, not Jonah. God rules in the kingdoms of men, not Jonah. It wasn't Jonah's right to decide whether Nineveh should live or die. Such things are God's business and we must not presume to make demands on such.

Now for our lesson! It is easy and commonplace for people to mentally convert blessings into rights. God has blessed us all in so many ways – even people who are unbelievers are richly blessed by the One who brings the sun and rain (Matthew 5:43-45). I may just become so accustomed to being blessed that I see God's blessings as entitlements. I feel I somehow deserve them or I'm entitled to them because I'm used to having them. But that disposition was wrong for Jonah and is wrong for me.

Don't take God's blessings for granted. I do not enjoy my daily bread and shelter and friends and church and the air I breathe because I have a right to them. I have them because God is gracious to me. And in the event that God chooses to remove the blessings, may we all say with Job, "Naked came I out of my mother's womb, and naked shall I return thither: the Lord gave, and the Lord hath taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord" (Job 1:21).

# A Dangerous Trend in Worship KEN BAIRD

A family visits a worship service at the invitation of one of our members. When asked for their opinion, their response is "Frankly, I was bored" It happens again and again, and we begin to worry.

A thorough investigation reveals at least two factors that could explain the difficulty we are having attracting new people:

- 1. To a large extent, the present generation has been raised on a diet of television where only perfection is allowed in the finished product. Mistakes and faux pas are edited out The speaker is dynamic and is every bit as important as the message he delivers. He is selected on the basis of his charisma and he is retained on the basis of the audience he attracts.
- 2. The theme of today's world is entertainment It may be sports, movies, TV, Nintendo, or it may take some other

form. But give today's generation a pause in their entertainment and they are immediately bored

Our conclusion is that we must make our worship more entertaining. We must be more conscious of the charisma and attracting power of our preachers. After all, we can't teach people if we bore them. And so the old proverbial end justifies the means.

### What's wrong with such an approach?

- 1. It's based on a complete misunderstanding of the purpose of worship. Worship is first and foremost to give something back to God in response to what He's given to us. An example is "We love Him because He first loved us" (1 John 4:19).
- 2. Our problem is not that we have provided a boring worship service. The solution is not that we must entertain this generation in order to interest them in God.
- 3. Our problem is that we haven't adequately taught what true worship is. We haven't instilled in our people such a love for God and Jesus that they will just naturally want to respond to Them from that love. And that love and that response, directed to God, and not to anyone else, will be so great that others will see that we have been with Jesus. To be bored with worship or to be concerned because someone else is bored with worship is to not understand worship and may mean that we haven't really worshiped!

# Time Well Spent! Wayne Harvell

Statisticians tell us that the average life span is now around 75 years. If you are under 30 then you think that is a long time. If you are older, you realize that is not really very long at all.

Some time ago, someone went to the trouble to research what people do with their time. If we live to be 75, most of us will have spent:

3 years, 24 hours a day, acquiring an education – grade school, high school, and college.

7 years eating, 24 hours a day – some more, some less, obviously.

14 years, day and night working.

5 years riding in automobiles or airplanes.

5 years talking with each other – again, some more, some less.

1 year sick or recovering from sickness.

24 years of our life sleeping!

3 years reading books, magazines, and newspapers.

12 years amusing ourselves – watching TV, going to movies, fishing, etc.

That totals 75 years. As I look at these statistics I think – suppose we spent every Sunday of our life, for 75 years worshipping during two services each Lord's Day – how much would that total for God? The answer 11 months!

Let's double that because we would also spend time each week in two Bible classes. That also totals 11 months.

Think about that – 5 years in an automobile and just 22 months in church. Twelve years amusing ourselves – 22 months in church learning and worshiping God. What does that say about the brevity of life and our priorities? How much time do we spend in preparations for eternity?
