

Eight and Eleven

Recently a news program gave information about changes that affect the population. They reported that on average in 2008 there would be one birth every eight seconds and one death every eleven seconds. That means that the population will continue to increase because births are occurring at a greater rate than deaths. The Bible, Ecclesiastes 3:2, tells us that there is "a time to be born, and a time to die."

Throughout the scriptures there are accounts of births taking place. For the most part there was joy with each birth. We even remember this event by celebrating a birthday each year. Solomon summarizes life in the twelfth chapter of Ecclesiastes. He begins with the need of remembering God in youth. He then progresses through the aging process. Finally he speaks about the end of life. What is his conclusion about life? He says that the "whole" of man is to "fear God and keep His commandments." Do we see that as the purpose of life? "What is your life?" (James 4:13) is a question each must answer.

As with births, the Bible speaks often about death. The entire chapter of Genesis five says over and over "and he died." Man must come to grips that death is a natural part of life. Our physical bodies have not been created to live forever (2 Corinthians 4:16). Regardless of what we may do to extend the length of life death will eventually come to all (Hebrews 9:27). The greatest need is to prepare for eternity before death comes. After death (Luke 16:19-31) ones destiny is sealed! How sad that many (Matthew 7:13-14) will meet the Creator unprepared. Those who die without having obeyed the gospel (2 Thessalonians 1:8-9) will suffer punishment.

Someone asked Robert Louis Stevenson, the author, what was the benefit of having a lamplighter. Stevenson responded that he was poking holes in the darkness.

Our Lord came into this world to provide light to those in darkness (Matt. 4:16; John 12:46). If our Lord had not come we would still be in the darkness of sin (John 8:12). He came not just to "poke holes in the darkness" but to bring light to the world (John 1:29).

"Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven" (Matt. 5:16). We sing about this "Little Christian Light" shining all around the neighborhood. Do you poke "holes in the darkness" when you are at school? Do you poke "holes in darkness" when you participate in extracurricular activities? What about when you are at home?

Darkness can be scary. Ever been in a cave where the lights were turned off? Sin is scary (Rom. 6:23). It brings death! But if we "walk in the light" (Psalm 119:105; 1 John 1:7) we can save ourselves and others (1 Tim. 4:16). The work of the lamplighter was for the good of others. Today will you help someone see the light?

Let us be like the "wise virgins" (Matt. 25) who had their lamps ready. Are you ready to poke holes in the darkness?
