## **VACATION TIME**

Summertime brings with it the opportunity for many families to go on a vacation. Children are out of school, parents may have vacation time saved up, and the weather is great. Let's take off to our favorite place or explore someplace new. Vacations allow families to spend quality time with one another. Parents get to take a break from the regular work week. Vacations can be great. Jesus told his disciples to "rest a while" because they "had no leisure" (Mark 6:31). We use vacations for the same purpose. However, there can be spiritual dangers for Christians when it comes to vacation time.

Will our vacation be a vacation from God? When some get away they also get away from God. They will not include time for worshiping with the saints. The writer of the book of Hebrews said we should not "forsake the assembling of ourselves together" (Heb. 10:25). Most vacations allow us to enjoy the wonders of God's creation. Hasn't He created some beautiful and wonderful places? Do we begin to worship the creation rather than the Creator? Paul says that is sin (Rom. 1:25). Those who would normally not miss services while at home, make an exception while on vacation. Isn't it a danger to take a vacation from God?

Will our vacation cause us to rob God? A serious question was asked in the days of Malachi. "Will a man rob God?" (Malachi 3:8). Some spend more on a vacation than they give to God in a year. The Jews of Malachi's day were busy taking care of their personal needs rather than offering the tithe to God that was required of them. That is how they became robbers. We are commanded (1 Cor. 16:1, 2) to give to God. We should not forget the work of our home congregation while on vacation. The work of the church continues while we may be on vacation. Will we allow the expense of a vacation to cause us to cut our contribution? It is a danger to rob God for a vacation.

Will our vacation include immodest clothing? Beginning with Spring Break and continuing through the summer many flock to the beach. Yes, immodesty is a danger when at the beach or at home. A Christian should be concerned about modest clothing at all times. Paul wrote that "women adorn themselves in modest apparel" (1 Tim. 2:9). God has no double standards (Tit. 2:5; 1 Tim. 5:22—women are to be *chaste* and men are to be *pure*, same word) when it comes to clothing. Men and women, alike, should dress modestly. The Jewish priest (Ex. 28:40ff) was required to wear clothing that covered their thighs. Bathing suits (definitely) and most shorts don't cover that much of the lower body. Suffice it to say that modesty is not on display at the beach. We don't want to dress in such a way as to cause someone to stumble (Matt. 5:28; 18:7). Vacation time doesn't permit the child of God to dress immodestly. It is a danger to dress immodestly.

There's nothing wrong with vacations. They can be great times. However, these are some dangers (sins) that we need to avoid when vacationing. Have a great time on your vacation but don't forget God, rob Him or dress immodestly.

## **Ranger Keefe Abrams**




9th Grade: Stanhope Elmore Marching Band, JROTC 1, Convert Band, Honors Classes, Taekwondo, Robotics

## Spare Tire Religion Brandon Britton

Most of us keep a spare tire in the trunk of our car to use in case of an emergency. We do not normally ride around on a spare tire, but use it temporarily while our regular tire is being fixed and then we put it back in the trunk. Now consider how many people there are who try to keep God in their trunk. To them He is nothing more than a quick fix in an emergency. God is not a part of their regular, everyday lives, but just someone they turn to when times get difficult and they have nowhere else to go. God is their spare tire, kept in the trunk until hard times come and then put back when they are gone. They want all the blessings and privileges of being a Christian with none of the responsibilities and obligations.

Modern day people are not the first to have this skewed and flawed concept of God. Long ago in the days before a human king sat on the throne in Israel the people were practicing "spare tire religion." While Eli was the high priest and his sons served as priests, the nation grew corrupt. Their service to God was not heart felt allegiance and devotion, but calloused rituals and vain repetitions. We would describe them as "going through the motions" instead of worshipping in spirit and truth (John 4:23-24).

(As a side note, this is a powerful lesson to elders and preachers: when the leadership is corrupted, the people will quickly follow.) In 1 Samuel 4 there is a record of a battle between the Jews and Philistines. "And the Philistines put themselves in array against Israel: and when they joined the battle, Israel was smitten before the Philistines: and they slew of the army in the field about four thousand men" (1 Samuel 4:2). How does Israel respond to this crisis?

Prayer? Repentance? Faithful obedience? No.

They cry to the elders, "let us fetch the ark of the covenant of the Lord out of Shiloh unto us, that, when it cometh among us, IT MAY SAVE US out of the hand of our enemies" (1 Samuel 4:3). They believed they had God in a box! They viewed the ark, which was the place where God met with the people, as a magic box they could pull out in hard times and be safe. They trusted in the ark instead of God. They found out the hard way that God will not be manipulated and abused in this manner.

The Philistines not only killed thousands of the Hebrews, but they also took the ark as a spoil of war. The lesson is simple, if you will not serve God in the best of times, do not expect Him to bless you in the worst of times. God is not a spare tire; He cannot be kept in a magic box and you cannot keep Him in your trunk in case of emergency.

Christians, abandon this spare tire religion!
