Home Remedies

During the "good ole days" people relied on home remedies because a doctor wasn't always available. Even if one could be found you might not be able to afford his fee. Many today are returning to the idea of "home remedies." They are trying to find natural medicines in contrast to conventional treatments for disease.

We want to stress the word "HOME" in our title. Does the home, that is the family, need some attention because of various ills? Many homes are plagued with problems. What can be done to make our homes "well" again? Without a doubt following the right prescription will help. The best remedy is taking the scriptures and applying them liberally.

A CHEERFUL attitude is a good home remedy. Most of what we hear through the media paints a very bleak picture of home life in America. If these statistics are any where near correct then we need a remedy. We need to restore hope to our homes! Solomon wrote, "A merry heart doeth good like a medicine: but a broken spirit drieth the bones" (Pro. 17:22). How long has it been since real laughter was heard in your home? Someone has defined happiness this way—"It's like jam, you can't spread it around without getting some on yourself." Too many homes are filled with sorrow, sadness and sin. Paul offers this prescription in Romans 5:2, "By Whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and REJOICE in HOPE of the glory of God." Does your home need a good dose of cheer? It will go a long way toward improving the health of your home.

Another home remedy we need is GENTLENESS. A lack of gentleness can be seen by the words used in the home and how we treat one another. "A SOFT answer turneth away wrath: But grievous words stir up anger. The TONGUE of the WISE useth knowledge aright: But the mouth of FOOLS poureth out foolishness" (Pro. 15:1-2). How often are home torn apart because there is no gentleness to be found? Mary Poppins said, "A spoonful of sugar helps the medicine go down." Do you remember taking the polio vaccine in a sugar cube. The sugar made the medicine more "gentle" to take. Paul reminds us to "be kind one to another" (Eph. 4:32). If you've broken your arm, don't you want the doctor to be gentle while mending that hurt? If we follow the "Golden Rule" (Matt. 7:12) then we will use gentleness in helping our homes.

Removing ANGER is a necessary home remedy. "A wrathful man stirreth up strife: But he that is slow to anger appeaseth strife" (Pro. 15:18). Anger can be like a cancer. It will continue to grow and grow until it finally kills. We are to be "angry and sin not" (Eph. 4:28). How many, out of anger, have either said or done something that inflicted pain to their family? Paul, in the above verse, continues by saying, "let not the sun go down upon your wrath." The cure for anger needs to be taken quickly. Anger doesn't need to be allowed to fester into wrath and hatred. Anger is one of those diseases that needs immediate attention. It can have devastating effects on the lives of everyone within the home.

The final home remedy that needs to be taken is FORGIVENESS. From time to time everyone within a home will need forgiveness? Why? We are accountable persons who sin. God has offered each of us forgiveness through His Son. Jesus is the prescription to attain forgiveness. We can only be forgiven if we forgive others (Matt. 6:12). Husbands and wives need to be forgiving of one anther. Parents and children should forgive each other. Brothers and sisters and family members are to offer forgiveness when the erring repents (Luke 17:3-4). Think for a moment about the forgiveness depicted in Luke 15 of the father and his prodigal son. Dwell on the thought of our Savior hanging on the tree for our forgiveness. We are to forgive "one
